


VECTOR ARTWORK (PREFERRED)

Vector artwork is art that is made up of vector graphics. These graphics are points, lines, curves and shapes that are based on mathematical formulas. This enables them to become scalable to any size without losing image quality. Providing a vector file will allow more flexability for design adjustments. Programs like Adobe Illustrator and CorelDRAW are generally used to create a vector art.








RASTER FILE

Raster artwork is created using pixels (tiny dots) that use color and tone to produce the image. These images are usually produced by a digital camera. Each image can only contain a fixed number of pixels; the amount of pixels determines the quality of the image (resolution). The quality of a raster image plays an important role when being scaled for print, and depends on the originial image size. The Adobe Photoshop program is generally used for raster based files.
